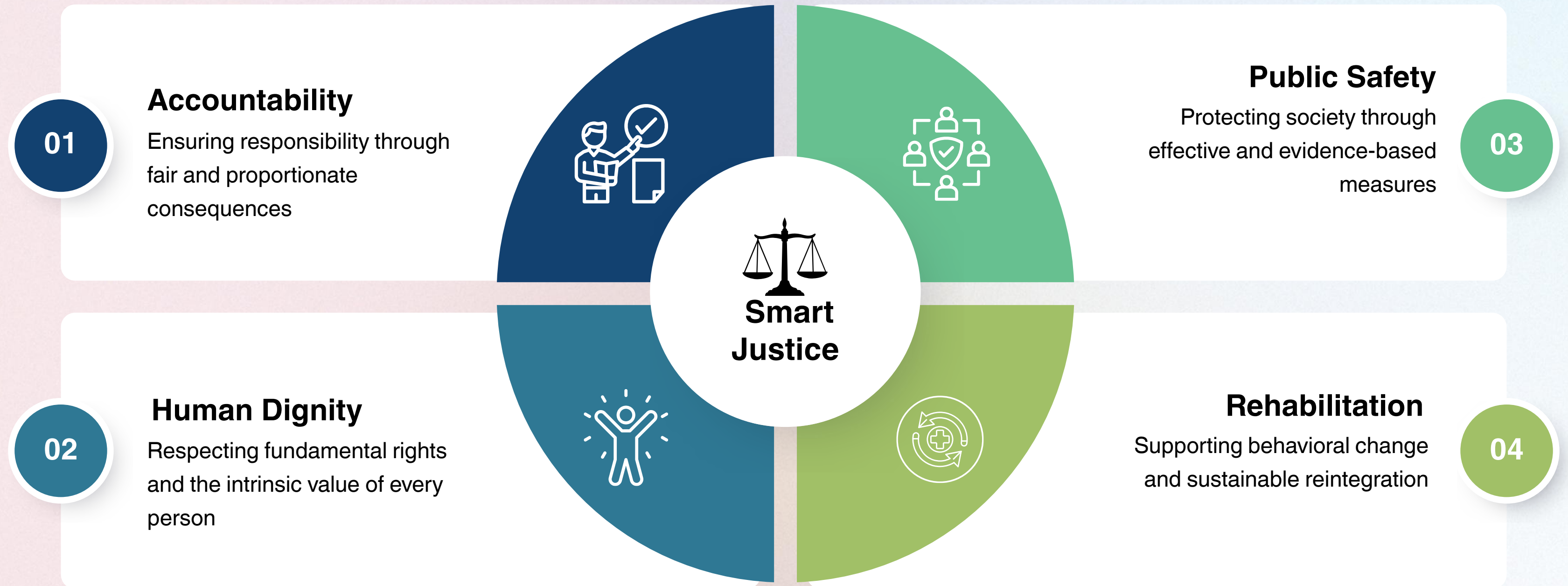
- 1 Prison - Last Resort**
Reserved for serious offenses and high-risk individuals
- 2 Probation & Supervision**
Ensuring accountability while maintaining community ties
- 3 Community-Based Corrections**
Rehabilitation within society through structured support
- 4 Prevention & Social Support**
Addressing root causes and reducing risk of offending



Modern justice systems prioritize prevention and reintegration, while imprisonment remains a necessary but limited intervention.

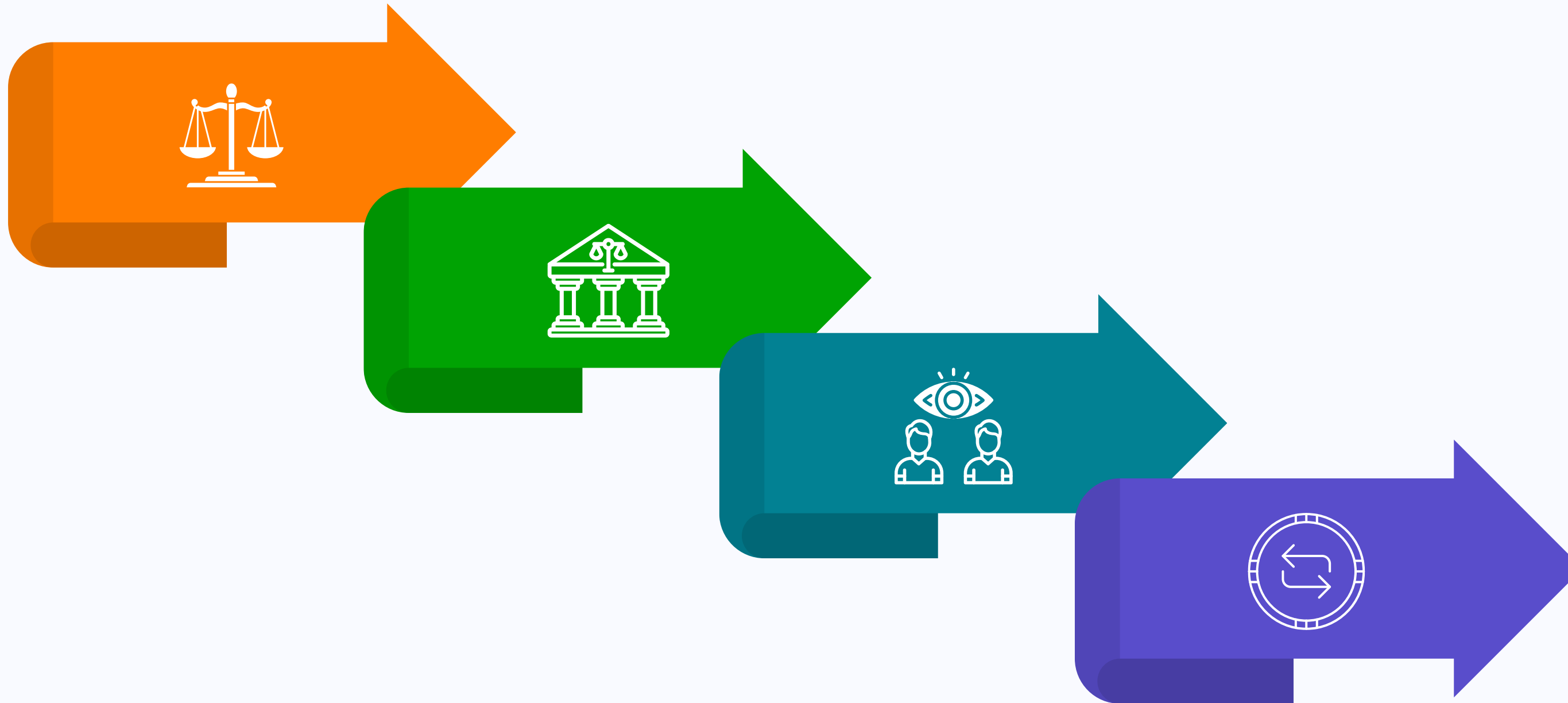


WHY IS 'SMART JUSTICE'?





From Sentencing to Reintegration



- Sentencing**
Judicial decision based on proportionality and legal standards
- Custodial / Non-Custodial Measures**
Imprisonment or alternative sanctions based on risk and context
- Supervision**
Structured monitoring, guidance, and accountability mechanisms
- Reintegration**
Gradual return to society with social and institutional support



Current System Pressure



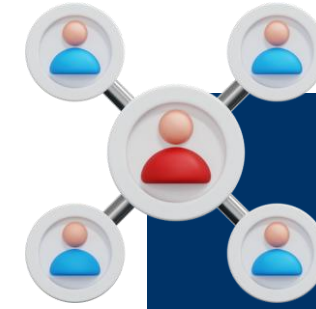


LEGAL REFORM DIRECTION

Reducing crime through early intervention and risk mitigation

Supporting individuals to return as responsible members of society

The Role of Frontline Professionals

Conduct risk and needs assessments

Frontline professionals evaluate both the likelihood of reoffending (risk) and the individual's personal and social needs. This allows for tailored interventions that are more effective and appropriate for each case.

Provide supervision and behavioral guidance

Their role is not limited to monitoring compliance with legal conditions. They also guide individuals toward positive behavioral change, helping them adopt more constructive and law-abiding lifestyles.

Connect individuals with social support systems

Frontline professionals act as facilitators, linking individuals to essential services such as employment, education, mental health support, and community networks. These connections are vital for successful reintegration.

Bridge the gap between law and society

They translate legal frameworks into real-life practice. By understanding both legal requirements and social realities, they ensure that justice is applied in a way that is both effective and socially responsive.

Enhancing data accuracy



Technology helps collect and manage data in a more structured and systematic way, reducing human error and improving the accuracy of information.

Supporting decision-making

Digital systems facilitate communication and information sharing among institutions, making collaboration faster and more effective.

RISKS & LIMITATIONS

Risk of bias in algorithms

If the data used is biased or incomplete, the system may produce unfair outcomes or favor certain groups.



Lack of transparency

Some technological systems are difficult to understand, making oversight and accountability more challenging.



Erosion of due process

Overreliance on technology may reduce adherence to legal procedures that ensure fairness and protect individual rights.



Over-reliance on systems

Excessive dependence on technology may weaken human judgment and create risks when systems fail or experience disruptions.
